

**Peyton M. Craighill** has been Polling Manager for the Washington Post since January 2011, managing news polling for the Post including monthly and weekly national surveys on politics, social and economic issues and a variety of newsworthy topics. Partnering with ABC News, The Kaiser Family Foundation, the Pew Research Center and others, he manages all aspects of the survey process for national, regional and state polls. In addition to news polls, Peyton manages internal projects for the Research and Analytics department, providing research services for various business departments to understand the Washington DC market and beyond.

Prior to the Post, Peyton was a Senior Associate at Greenberg Quinlan Rosner Research, running the Democracy Corps poll, managing polls for the Los Angeles Times/USC and National Public Radio. Before his work at GQRR, Peyton was the Assistant Director of polling for ABC News, working on a broad array of international and national polling. Peyton served on the Survey Committee for the National Election Pool, helping to design exit polling for every primary and general election in the 2008 cycle.

Peyton started his professional research career at the Pew Research Center. He worked on a variety of the Pew projects – from People-Press, Global Attitudes and Social Trends – to the integration of the larger Center.

He is a graduate of Hobart College and Rutgers University, where he studied under Cliff Zukin and got his start on the Star-Ledger/Eagleton/Rutgers poll.

Peyton has been actively involved in AAPOR since 1999 when he was a graduate student. He served as co-chair of the Heritage Committee (2003-2006) and has attended nearly every conference since Portland in 2000 (missed Montreal in 2006 to get married!). He is an active member of DC AAPOR, serving as Program Chair (2005-2006). He was active in the NY AAPOR, also serving as Program Chair (2008-2010).
